#### **Principles**

Cheadle Primary School is committed to promoting inclusion and equality thus ensuring that no child will be discriminated against due to their religion, beliefs, economic circumstances or social and cultural background.

It is important that our children feel a sense of pride, community and belonging to our school. We believe that wearing a smart and practical uniform allows all children to feel equal to their peers and confident in their appearance.

We are committed to ensuring that our school uniform policy reflects value for money, health and safety, practicality and activity-appropriate clothing.

#### **School Uniform**

To promote a sense of pride and belonging, we ask that children have a sweatshirt or cardigan with the school logo on it. This can be purchased through Monkhouses

To ensure that costs of uniform are kept to a minimum, all other items are unbranded so that parents and carers are able to achieve best value for money through a range of clothes shops and supermarkets.

- School sweatshirt or cardigan (blue Nursery –Year 5, purple Year 6)
- Black or dark grey plain trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- Plain white polo shirt or a white short/long sleeved shirt
- Black, grey or white socks
- Black or grey tights
- Blue and white checked dress (with shorts underneath if required)
- Black shoes or plain black unbranded trainers

Children need shoes that are flat, comfortable and which provide good support. They need to be able to run about and use the outdoor play equipment safely.

#### **School PE Kit**

On the day (s) that your child has PE, they should attend school in their kit along with their school sweatshirt or cardigan.

- Plain black or blue shorts
- Plain white t-shirt
- Trainers
- Plain black or blue jogging bottoms or leggings for outdoor games
- Swimming costumes must be one piece / swimming trunks / shorts

## **Items Provided by School**

When children start school with us (in Nursery, Reception or later), they receive the following items.

- Free water bottle (replaced annually)
- Free reading book bag
- Free purple sweatshirt or cardigan for Year 6 children

## **Jewellery and Make up**

Make up and fashion jewellery are not permitted. A standard watch may be worn however this remains the responsibility of the child. If this become a distraction in lessons the child may be asked to remove it. For safeguarding reasons, internet enabled devices are not permitted in school.

Small stud earrings may be worn however, due to health and safety, these must be removed or covered with tape prior to any PE lessons. Jewellery relating to religious beliefs is permitted.

## **Adverse Weather conditions**

In hot weather, children should wear a hat, sunglasses with UV protection and sunscreen. In cold weather, children should wear a coat, hat, scarf and gloves when outside.

## **Labelling and Lost Property**

All clothing that your child is likely to remove must be clearly labelled.

If a child accidentally takes an item of clothing home that belongs to someone else, please return to it school.

Whilst we endeavour to ensure that any lost unnamed clothing is returned to its owner, any unclaimed items will be retained in school for a term and if not collected, either included in our pre-loved uniform sales or donated to charity.

## **Accessibility**

The Governing Board is committed to ensuring that uniform is affordable and available to all. The school holds regular pre-loved uniform sales in the playground at the end of the school day. We welcome donations of uniform that your child has outgrown.

The Governing Board is committed to its obligation to accommodate religious or cultural requirements in relation to uniform to ensure that it is not discriminatory on the grounds, of gender, race, religion or belief.
