Stories, Songs, Poems and Rhymes	<p>Appreciate stories, songs, poems & rhymes in the language; context of finding out where people live.</p> <p>Join in a song or poem with familiar structures to help remember a new language.</p> <p>Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes, link the spelling, sound/meaning of words in the context of exploring ordinal numbers</p>
